Greetings from your community library! I hope this letter finds you well and looking forward to the months ahead.

As we transition into what promises to be a busy summer, we're reaching out to everyone in the community we serve – the 9,000 residents of the Skaneateles School District, including parts of Marcellus, Niles, Owasco, Sennett and Spafford – to update you on the library's operations and summer programs.

The library is open on the same schedule as we were pre-COVID: 7 days and 63 hours per week. While we still have some adjustments to our space in place due to social distancing requirements, appointments are no longer required and masks are not necessary for the fully vaccinated. If you are not fully vaccinated, please continue to wear your mask.

We're excited to announce that the book sale will be back this July at the Village Hall, and we'll be hosting outdoor programs throughout the summer, both on the library lawn and at Austin Park. We're continuing with a few virtual programs as well, so there will hopefully be something for everyone!

If you're one of the many people who've been enjoying the convenience of curbside pickup, you'll be glad to know that we have no plans to stop offering that service anytime soon. Sometimes you just need to grab it and go, and we're happy to help you get on your way.

But if you're ready to browse, need to use a computer and could use some help from our staff, the library's doors are open.

ONLINE—Mindfulness, Meditation & Movement


Wednesdays, July 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th at 9:30 AM

ONLINE—LEGO Build: Disaster Island




OUTSIDE—Fairy and Gnome Houses




ONLINE—Elementary School Book Club




